#### Other info:

- MCPS evaluates and measures Blair on a number of things including English and Math, GPA, Suspensions, AP Scores, College test scores, graduation rate, and counseling programs
- Current students: 2962 (873 9th graders)
- Blair's SAT scores last year better than MCPS, Maryland, and national averages; major improvement on SAT and ACT scores from 2012 t o2016
- New MCPS policy: no more final exams; quarterly assessments instead
- All MCPS staff gets religious diversity guidance (can be found on MCPS website)
- Blair got a .5 FTE increase for the Registrar position and new Chromebooks
- Blair started a free dinner program for all students
- Rec Zone starts Monday every day 2:30-5pm
- Outdoor track has been renovated
- Hopefully Blair will have a new graduation venue in 2017; seniors finish May 25; graduation date TBD (currently June 7 at DAR)
